 - o Creating a positive environment where the student's see themselves in the curriculum

- Hiring for the recent increased sections is done
- Starting to plan Grade 8 transitions, parent nights info nights and looking to have community support events
- <u>Budget</u> Operating budget has increased from last year, set at just now over \$75,000
 - Largest expenditures:
 - Educational Supplies technology, arts, and science
 - General school operations (office supplies, paper, photocopying, learning materials like white board markers)
- Fundraising CW's will be looking to do fundraising to upgrade the cafeteria to be better equipped for events, performances, etc.
 - o 2 biggest costs will be a projector, sound mixer, and lights switchboard
 - Details to follow on those costs, but for reference the projector which is our 1st priority will cost \$7-\$10,000
