Physical and Health Education	The PSK4U - Introduction to Kinesiology class ran a successful Little Buddies program with Mrs. Kaitlyn's kindergarten class at Orleans Wood this past semester. This is the first time back to Orleans Wood in 5 years for the Kinesiology students.	
	The Little Buddies program helps support kindergarten aged children once per week throughout the first semester. The goal of the program is to develop the children's fundamental movement skills and physical literacy in accordance with Canada's Long Term Athlete Development Model. # 7.5 Principal's Report (A. Murphy)

- Bump and slid with the weather this week requiring a full day of exams on the Monday and Tuesday
- Destreaming updates:
  - o 1st phase all grade 9 students are together (i.e. no more academic and applied streams)
  - Now grade 10 students are together
  - o 25% are in learning sprints or with a curriculum coach
  - o Departmental learning sprints at staff meetings teachers are presenting what is working well in their classes
- School Improvement Plan:
  - o Increase in literacy, numeracy goal
  - o Next meeting will bring in the improvement plan, would like our input into the plan
- Semester II:
  - o New positions, new sections, courses and new hires
  - o Begin to plan for next school year with V.P., department heads,
  - o Projections for the number of students anticipated likely growing for next year (grade 9 200 students)

- o There will be more emergency procedure drills in semester II
- o Feb. 12<sup>th</sup> report cards will be going out to students
- o Grade 8s are coming in one school at a time for orientations
- Budget
  - o Received 50% in November, we have now received the remaining 50%
  - Received \$34,730 initially; therefore total = \$90,000 Operating Budget
