Requirements for Success:

- Students will need to login (check in with the teacher daily for program #2).
- Assessment and evaluation expectations of students include direct engagement by students in all activities culminating in triangulation of knowledge, skills and abilities toward final marks.
- As this is a virtual learning opportunity, in order to participate in this program students will need to have access to technology and the internet. Students who require technology and access to the internet should communicate their needs to their Guidance Counsellor.
- It will be important for students to realize that their mark may not improve upon completion of the upgrading course or credit recovery program.
- For students in Grade 9 and 10 courses only the higher mark will be recorded in the student transcript. For students in Grade 11 and 12 all attempts at the course will show on the transcript. The attempt with the highest mark will be the one that is included in the credit count; all other attempts at the course will show as an R in the credit count column of the Ontario Student Transcript.
