Tickets on sale in the den at lunch.</p> <p>There is a buyout performance on Wednesday, May 29th</p> <p>Laramie Project- a brief synopsis In 1998, a young gay man, Matthew Shephard, was beaten and left for dead in Laramie, Wyoming, sparking a national outcry against hate crimes. This documentary-style play was created by the Tectonic Theater Project and Moises Kaufman who visited the town and conducted over 200 interviews with the residents of Laramie.</p>

7. Principal's Report

- Jennifer was not available to attend the meeting.

7. Vice-Principal Report

- Anne reported on behalf of the VPs and the Principal
- There are several sports activities happening at the moment, including track and field which involves many students.
- The athletic banquet will take place June 12.
- The black out period for field trips is coming up in the middle of June. This allows students to focus on their exams and their summatives.
- Grad breakfast will take place June 13.
- Exams start June 19.
- Prom is June 26 at the Chateau Laurier.
- Staff appreciation breakfast has been scheduled for June 27.
- Commencement ceremonies will take place on June 28.
- School use for the craft fair will be submitted for November 15 and 16
- School climate survey was done about two weeks ago. There was a participation rate of 77%. Along with a set of standard questions, students are invited to provide anonymous comments in a free text area. Results from the survey draw comparisons to other schools. The survey will help the school to focus on areas of concern. Overall, a large number of CW students are positive about the school experience.
- Anne confirmed that she will be moving to Colonel By in September as VP there. The current VP at Colonel By will move to CW. They are currently taking the opportunity to visit each other's schools to become familiar with them before the actual transition.
- Second stage of science lab renovations have begun. Hopefully, the work will be completed in time for the start of the school year next year.
- Mr. Bonnell and Mr. Boulerice will be moving in September to Nepean High School

8. Financial Report

- Marcia reported that School Council has \$3631.49 with \$1524.30 in reserve for planned expenditures.
- It was suggested that the Parent Involvement cheque (\$500) be rolled into Council funds.
- Council discussed the various options for spending the money on the larger ticket items brought forward by staff. It was eventually agreed that \$3500 would be given to the school to cover CW branding (logo on the wall/outdoor flags), one additional cafeteria table and any other renovations that will improve the school. Staff will report back to Council confirming what the money is used for. All in favour. (As we were a couple of people short of quorum, Mark sent an email requesting additional votes.)
- Additional discussions were held about possible fundraisers for next year including an online silent auction and a trivia night.

9. PRO Grant

- Stephanie reported that while it was a small group that attended the event, it was well received.
- Stephanie will share Poppy's contact details with the school in case they would like to bring her in as a speaker for the students.
- Not clear yet if funding will be available from the government for next year for PRO grants.

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10. Relay for Life

- \$80 000 has been raised to date, with more anticipated.
- Thanks to all those that participated and those that volunteered.
- A total of 316 students actually participated in the event. Numbers were lower than anticipated (over 400) likely due to the weather.
- Students who did not participate were expected to attend school but numbers at school were disproportionately low. This will be further examined for future events.
- Students who participated will receive volunteer hours for the time spent outside of the regular school day.
- Discussions were held about the Relay in general—lack of communication to the parents, apparent lack of grade 9 engagement, lower numbers that signed up then in the past, the requirement to be on a team.....

11. Other Business

- Anne addressed some of the concerns about vaping at school and the lack of awareness surrounding vaping. Parents and students need more information on this topic.
- A parent raised concerns about drugs being offered for sale in the washrooms. Anne reiterated the importance of reporting these incidents. Reporting will be anonymous and parents can report on behalf of their child. There continues to be reluctance to reporting due to concerns of retribution.

12. Next Meeting

- The next council meeting will be Thursday, June 20 @ 7pm in the Learning Commons.

- The meeting was adjourned at 8:30 p.m.
