 - a) Voices (Student) Report Sam Loveridge

- i) Amanda Canham will run a Credit Recovery class during exams, Friday, January 25 Thursday, January 31
- ii) Rick Sambell and Performance Course will host: "Rent a Shakespearean Actor" for Valentine's Day. A student will perform a sonnet for a donation.

c)Principal's Report - Kevin Gilmore

- Christmas Assembly was mainly organised by the students, and even though Friday, December 21, was declared a snow day, the assembly was extremely well attended. It proved, once again, to be one of the most popular events held.
- ii) Prom Committee will be performing a flash mob in the cafeteria on Monday, January 14. They will run periodic events and fund raisers leading up to prom.
- iii) Dates to Remember:

- vi) Staffing Changes: Ms. Jamie Tweedy has resigned 1/2 of her position, Ms. Amanda Canham, Ms. Jen Abma
- vii)Labour Dispute: On January 2, 2013, the Ontario cabinet imposed the terms of the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) entered into on July 5, 2012. The contracts imposed by government expire August 31, 2014. Teachers have always had the right not to do extra curricular activities, but it is hoped that they will now begin to participate as it is these activities that make a school vibrant and alive. Most teachers in the past have chosen to participate. The union has reminded teachers that they do not have to go beyond their school day. It is too soon to say how teachers will respond. Our teachers did a great job in the classrooms in the fall semester. We will have to wait and see if some programs such as Literacy Partners will continue.
- viii)Highlights of "Question and Answer" with Principal Gilmore: If students were to leave Cairine Wilson for the Catholic Board it could result in fewer teachers at Cairine (market share). It is very unfortunate for those students who have lost their favourite sports and extra curricular teams this year. How can parents encourage teachers to volunteer, and to let the teachers know that the students value them and miss them in a coaching capacity?
