Grade 12 to Post Sec. www.electronicinfo.ca Colleges: www.ontariocolleges.ca School is visited by about 30 universities and colleges do presentations for students If one has an IEP they need to look at "Make the cut" Program IEP info is not automatically passed on, student needs to self-advocate, student will be given a package to take with them, funds are available to student for educational support, it is recommended for them to do a Psychological Educational assessment

<u>The Green Room</u> (snapshot only) Student Success Teacher, EA's Room and support is available before school, during school and after school Assist students at risk, Credit Rescue

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Tiered Referral Process

First Tier-most students (80%) are supported in the classroom Second Tier- if this doesn't work the student is referred to the Green Room (15% of students) Take a closer look at issues and how to solve, e.g. make sure if an IEP is needed it is in place Third Tier-Intensive level of Intervention- (5% of students) can involve calling in an outside Psychologist, having an itinerant EA, etc
