Report

- Great school opening. We have exceeded our expected number of students.
 - May get additional classes as a result.
- Many new staff members have been hired.
- #Resist Regulation 274: Staffing has been more challenging since Regulation 274 came into effect. The regulation has unintended consequences such as limiting hiring choices available to the principals; they must interview the 5 candidates highest on the seniority list before considering any new candidates. It has also resulted in part-time positions all over the system where many teachers would like full-time. Any parents with concerns are invited to contact their MPP.
- Capital Courts Academy has been approved. Girls from other schools will be attending CW but be competing in basketball with Capital Courts Academy.
- LINK crew students have been outstanding with grade 9 transition and 80 plus new CW students
- We had an estimated 300 parents arrive for Meet the Teacher night.
- Ottawa Public Health will be making presentations to grade 9's October 3 & 10 about opioids
- School Website will be revised by November 1.
- Other social media communication methods will be used to inform students, their families and the community about school accomplishments and upcoming events.

- Pride Day held in August. CW had the largest contingent of students and parents yet.
- Locker system distribution of lockers to students went very well this year
- CW has 12-15 foreign students attending from Columbia, Spain and Germany. A trip to Wakefield including a Quebecois dinner is being planned for these students.
- CW is reviewing the school dress code. Based on the Model Student Dress Code of Oregon Now, discussions will take place with staff first then parents and finally students before adopting policy. However, the school board is also reviewing the dress code at this time.

<u>Financial report</u> – Darlene Avelar (treasurer)

- We are starting the year with a balance of \$3204.35.
- Last year's staff appreciation breakfast went slightly over budget (\$260 versus \$250) and it has been proposed to increase the budgeted amount to \$275 for the 2017-18 school year. Voting will take place after council elections
