<u>Guest Report</u> – Mr. Boulerice and 2 students from his civics class spoke about DILA (A **D**ay of Information for a **L**ifetime of **A**ction). Students pick a cause to change the world. The students in the class decided to do something to promote healthy living in the school community and their proposal is called 'The Nose Job', i.e., New Outdoor Sports Equipment'. They propose replacing the basketball nets and

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concrete courtyard as they are currently in very poor condition and a safety issue. The school community was surveyed through Kahoot and 95% of respondents thought fixing the basketball court was important. The class requested a \$1000 contribution from School Council to replace the nets (\$500 each). Are also talking to the Wolverines (Gloucester-Cumberland Basketball Association) for support as well.

Teacher's Report - Majed Turk

- Expressed thanks for the camera approval.
- J. Cleveland: Has used the money to purchase all steel required to build three welding booths. He and the students are about half-way completed in building them; hoping to have them installed by Christmas. Waiting on word from the Board on whether they will help with the electrical and HVAC. Canadian Welders Association will be supplying some new welders.
- Mr. Boulerice is organizing the next Europe trip for March 2019: from Vimy to Juno. Students will
 visit Berlin, Amsterdam, Paris, Normandy beaches of WWII and Vimy Ridge. Parent information
 night is November 6th at 6:30 in the library.
- J. Kirby and D. Adeney:
 - OUAC application PINs have been distributed; some remain unclaimed. Post-secondary "Grad Presentation" was delivered to all Grade 12 students on Oct. 25th and is now posted on CW > Student Services Website for parents to review as well.
 - University Information Fair held on Oct 26th with all 21 Ontario Universities represented went well.
 - November 1st Parent Info Night for Grade 12 students, featuring information from Carleton,
 Uottawa, Algonquin, Canadian Forces and the Discover Year Program.
- C. Coulombe: Grade 12 immersion students are writing the DELF exams on Nov 13 (level B2) and Nov 14 (level B1). In total 29 out of 30 students are registered; 10 writing B2 (the highest level) and 19 writing B1 level. Oral interviews will be held on 440 Albert Street between November 14 and December 1st.
- A. Robinson-Sisk: This year 20 students took part in Halloween for Hunger. Thank you to the
 dance and door decorating and contributions to the food drive. All collected food will be donated to
 the Cumberland Food Bank. Dymon storage on Innes has graciously accepted to collect the packed
 boxes and drop them off at the food bank on our behalf.
- A. Robinson-Sisk and T. Kelly: Cairine Wilson will be hosting a delgation/SDG (sustainable development goals) training session (December 12th) and Model UN (MUN) simulation (February 8th) with 100 students from eastern schools in the OCDSB.

- T. Kelly and R. Sciortino: December 8 to 9th will be the 3rd annual Camp in the Caf an event to raise awareness and funds to support refugees locally and internationally. Locally, funds will be donated to help newcomer students at Ridgemont HS. Last year, funds were used to give newcomer students the opportunity to attend Winterlude events including a skate on the canal. Internationally, will be donating money to select NGOs that work on the ground with refugees (Syrian and Rohingya this year). This year we will be combining the event with the 30 Hour Famine, so students will fast and sleep in the mock camp. Parent council can support this event by spreading the word and encouraging families in the community to attend.
- D. Napoléon: 170 students participated in the Halloween Dance on October 26th. For Halloween, Voices organized Candygrams distribution, door decorating and costume contests. Voices now planning a spirit week for November. They are looking forward to helping out at the Craft Fair.
